- Capital Improvement Plan Do we have one? If not, we need to do one as we have an obligation to maintain the public trust. The township properties (civic center, fire hall, ball field, Barlow ballpark, Bruce park, cemetery, etc.) need a capital improvement plan. Easier to get grants.
- Carrie updated the commission on the F-41 bridge.
- Carrie and Lary to have RRC course completed by next meeting.
- Marketing the Hall for rentals in order to collect more financial resources to maintain the civic center. A civic center millage was mentioned, but not welcomed.
- We should have a social media policy. Example if we need to kick anyone off the Facebook page it should be documented for public record.
- Broadband options:
- There are providers that would apply for grants on the townships behalf, as installing their service would benefit them.
- Helping low-income households pay for home broadband. Options like Connect USA and Starlink.
